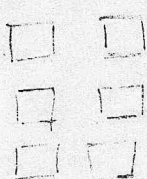

General Information "4 vestibule windows are totally inside, being partitions
of the vestibule, and hence will have no light other than the light from
inside. Later I will send drawings of these windows. I feel that tan or
lavender will be appropriate if in light shades, and tone in with the
little windows that abut on them from the outside."

For the present, Fr. Johnson wants only the 2 doors, each containing 6 panels.
Father Johnson wrote: "I have decided to have the 8 little panels in
the front door taken out and lead glass put in - it occurs to me that
these should syncretise with the other work. Of course as the idea would
be to give light to the vestibule, they would be most likely of very
light-yielding tints." (8/5/46 - They are going to have the small rectangular
groups, with blues in place of the lavender.)
