General Information These panels are actually the lower part of the regular
aisle window - same size. They would also need the usual iron frames.

They should be in simple grisaille - three medallion shapes with
colorful musical figures in the upper medallions.

Meth. Angels, and said: "perhaps the window in St. Cecilia's Cathedral, Omaha
comes nearest, although this suggests a somewhat darker window than our thought
for yours. At least it has the decorative medallion unit and the colorful
figure in the upper portion. We had in mind a foliated pattern but in a much
lighter treatment. The photo of the windows in Trinity Ch. Newton, comes a
little nearer the character of the field, but here again the pattern is
