largely in clear glass; so that one can see into the church from the
Tower Room.

Be sure the stole is purple, be careful of too much hair; and have the
name of the saint in the window.

This window, devoted to the Cure D'Ars, represents
him counselling a penitent.

Above is a group of other penitents coming to
confession, while near at hand is a suggestion of the
confessional. (Change the design of the Confessional, with a
half door and curtain).

The design is kept light and brilliant in recognition
of its position in secondary light.

Note: Father Dale didn't think the face looks anything like the Cure'd'Ars. We are
