General Information The donor wants just a decorative pattern, with perhaps some Christian symbolism - no figures. with the small figure of an angel of Prayer (like the window in St. Stephen's Church, Fall River, Mass - centered in the pane, and facing East, and surrounded with a splash of color, similar to the large East window there - total effect to be the one and simply a part of the other.)

"The side chancel window is beautifully enriched with a foliated pattern again introducing the white fleur-de-lis of purity and supporting a colorful medallion devoted to a kneeling angel of prayer bearing censer. Although in somewhat lighter note, blue and ruby are again effectively introduced with touches of green and gold and the more abundant use of silver.

At the base is the inscription.
