General Information This window is in memory of Miss Burton's father, a former president of the University of Chicago, Dr. Ernest DeWitt Burton, and his wife.

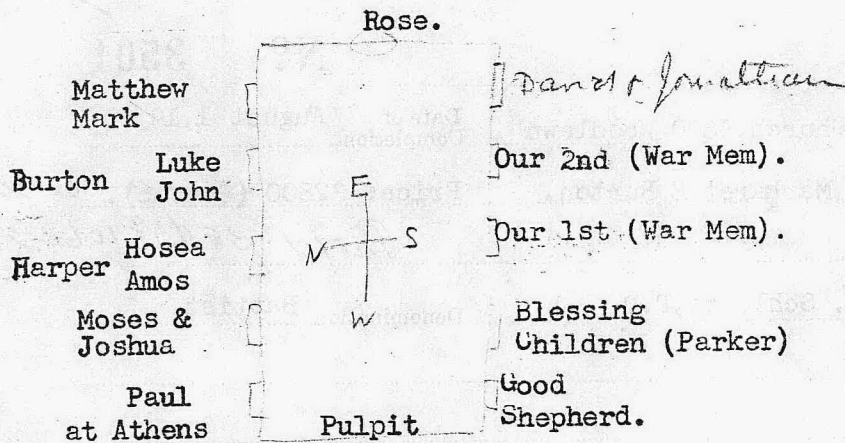
The two remaining windows on this side will be devoted to the Gospel writers, so this one will be the Evangelists Luke and John, to be carried out in about the same character of our two south memorials.

We are to include the text, "Ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." (from the Gospel of Saint John) - "use part of this in one panel and complete it in the other."

Also include some symbol of science as well as of religion in some subordinate place in the window.

Also, as her father was very much interested in the Chapel of Univ. of Chicago, a medallion that has some hint of the Chapel Tower would be a good thing, see\* In earlier window we assumed cost of removing interior wooden divisions.

\*photograph Dr. Schloerb sent. Also some medallion for her mother, suggesting her mother's hospitality - she did a great deal in entertaining students in her home. Incorporate some fitting symbol that would represent a mother and wife who was a great help to her husband. These can be in subordinate places.



We are also sending the color sketch for the Burton Memorial Window, devoted to Saint Luke and Saint John the Evangelist.

Both hold the evangelistic pens and books, - Saint Luke's inscribed with his traditional symbol of the winged ox.

Other well-known symbols are the artist's palette, recalling the legend of his painting the Virgin; and the caduceus, symbol of the great physician. The University Chapel is very roughly

suggested in the field.

Near Saint John are his symbol of the eagle and the chalice and serpent, recalling the incident of the poisoned cup which he drank without harm.

Below is the symbol of the wife and mother's hospitality toward the students.

In the tracery is the symbol of the lamp of truth, with stars of heavenly steadfastness at either side.

Above their heads are scrolls bearing the text from the Gospel of Saint John, "We shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free".

Across the base is the memorial inscription, "In loving memory of Edwige DeWitt Burton and his wife, F. M. Frances Mary Burton."
