

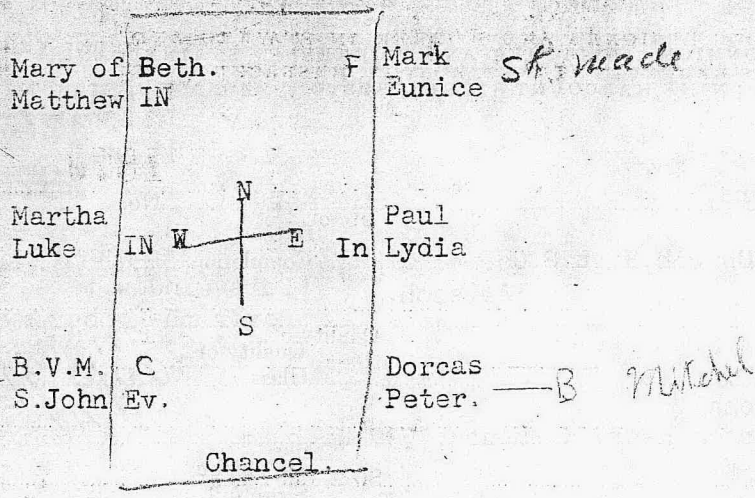

The first of these is devoted to Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and Saint John the Evangelist. Mary holds the lily, symbol of purity; while the beloved disciple holds the traditional chalice from which issues the dragon, symbolizing the legend of the poisoned cup from which he drank without harm.
