General Information The Lamb of God.

The Architect writes: "In the symbol they would like the banner standard back of the lamb as shown in your window for the Seattle Washington Church, instead of in front as indicated in the Eliot Congregational Church in Roxbury.

approved the color sketch for your east rose window in the Western Springs Methodist Church, and are sending it to you herewith.

The principal central symbol of the Lamb of God, on a field of ruby, the traditional color of divine love, is surrounded by a decorative pattern of grapevines, suggesting the significant words of Our Lord, "I am the Vine, ye are the branches".

An inner band of blue cloud forms is enriched with stars of heavenly steadfastness, and stars again occur at intervals through the outer ruby border.

The palette is well balanced, insuring a rich and colorful effect.

I think the lettering "Agnus Dei" on the banner can well be a little smaller and not broken, as it is in the sketch, but complete on one streamer. We can take care of this in the full size drawing.

IMPORTANT: The Architect says the lettering should be reduced in size - also reduce the size of the banner. They also wish the lamb to be slightly reduced in size so as to avoid too large an area of white.

Mr. Wrska says this will have to be set from the outside, requiring a scaffolding over the front door.
