



We have enjoyed our study of the chancel window for the North Parish Congregational Church of Sanford, and we feel that our color sketch, which we are sending herewith, suggests an excellent solution to the problem.

Christ the King is represented with sceptre and orb surmounted by the Cross, symbolizing His domination over the world. Below is the symbol of the Alpha and Omega, implying Christ's power and glory throughout eternity.

In the foliated field are stars of heavenly steadfastness, and the border is enriched with growing vine forms.

A space is designed at the base for a possible memorial inscription, but if none is required in the window, the border can be extended here to good purpose.

We have in mind a light and colorful palette, but we do not find the exposure of this window on the prints, and if it receives a strong illumination, the glass will undoubtedly need to be well patterned and textured to avoid the glare of light. Of course I shall want to visit the church and study the actual lighting before making the window.

~~A rather warm palette is suggested, and perhaps you and the donors would prefer more blue. I think that the background of the foliated border could be changed to blue to excellent purpose, including ruby in the narrow fillet lines at either side.~~
