General Information One panel, Baptismal story of Christ Blessing the Children; and in the other panel, the Eucharistic story of the Feeding of the Multitude.

Design for first window has been made, and we have contract. The final window will be the Crucifixion and the Resurrection, - farthest from chancel.

Chapel is rather modern in design, flag stone floor, walnut panelling to the ceiling, etc.

These are French windows, and will open inward.

the middle window in your Chapel, and are sending it to you herewith.

As planned, the first panel is devoted to Christ Blessing the Children, and the other to Feeding the Multitude.

Our Lord is represented in the upper part of both panels robed in ruby, traditional color of divine love. In the first panel He holds a small child while one hand is raised in blessing. A mother with other children are grouped below.

In the second panel, He stands before the multitude, while below the lad brings the fish and barley loaves to Philip and Andrew.

Across the base is the memorial inscription: "In Memory of Elwood Lindsay Haines Fifth Bishop of Iowa 1944-1949".

The window is designed in pure rich color to harmonize with the first one. We feel that it will work out beautifully in the color and light of the actual glass, and we are eager to continue its development.
