General Information Window to be a War Memorial to the boys and girls of Western High School, who died in World War II. Names to be put in an illuminated book between the two windows.

There are 18 inches between the two panels.

Perhaps a theme, such as "Truth", representing it as an allegorical figure, perhaps holding a book with a text such as "Ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free"; and designing symbols of the school activities, honors and military service around this central idea. (Something like the B.U. Window) Perhaps 2 Service for second panel.

The window will require a new sash. Its present division bar can be removed, bringing the sash down to a point a little over table height from the floor, and giving the glass opening of about 32 inches wide by 102 inches high. This

is with two inches of sash showing. School to take care of cost of supplying new sash, and filling in below the window with brick and mortar or wood panelling, preferably the letter, to carry the shape clear to the floor. They like the plan of certain chapel windows in the Foundry Church, which Mr. Skinner saw, - brought back a booklet.

Their school is somewhat heavy on Military training - they would like Military insignia, academic symbols, and the booklet may suggest something of a background in the academic field. - seals and insignia.
