General Information Make design for typical aisle window, with a patterned border, a very simple diamond field, and a medallion devoted to some incident from the life of Christ, - probably the Nativity.

It is the thought to eventually devote all these windows to significant incidents in the Life of Christ.

The crest is in full, rich color, with a ruby-winged seraphim, symbolical of divine love, in a field of pure blue, the traditional color of heavenly contemplation. Stars of steadfastness enrich the ruby border.
