General Information This window devoted to Saint Silas, goes next to the Saint Barnabas window in place. Corinth.

In the center panel, St. Silas stands holding the 5th chapter of Peter's first Epistle and a bishop's crozier. He was bishop of Antioch. In the left panel "the jealous Jews assault the house of Jason. Acts 17:15. Below in the quarry field the men of Sodom are represented assaulting the angels of the Lord. Genesis 19:1.

In the right panel, S. Paul and S. Silas are delivered from Prison by an earthquake. "A great Earthquake opened the prison doors". Acts 16:26. Below Daniel is being released from the lion's den. Daniel 6:20-22.

Saint Silas in cooperating with S. Paul exemplified the virtue of unselfishness. Consequently I have placed under him the figure of a man holding a money bag to his breast as a symbol of selfishness. Above are the cities, Athens, Corinth, Thessalonica, and Berea, which S. Paul and S. Silas visited and Samaria and Caesaria.
