General Information Represent Christ Blessing Children as the central motif.

This not only includes the figure of Our Lord, but suggests a family group and the integrity and beauty of family life as well.

Mr. Barber, the Architect, wrote: "They showed me a colorful picture of a window they like, which has an overall pattern and is quite colorful.

There should be some sort of a border, and a central theme which might occupy four or six panes, with all muntins left in place. The muntins in the window are 3/4" thick.

In relation to the border, the unit in each pane could be kept away from the muntins, so that it would be complete in itself, but would form a border in the series.

They like the general plan of the Evanston, First Congregational Church Wd, on Stairs.

We have kept in mind the minister's and the donor's liking for an over-all pattern with considerable color, but we do feel that there should be a large amount of light glass. This can be controlled with textures to keep it from appearing too brilliant.

As you will see, the central theme in the full color panel is Christ Blessing Little Children. It would be possible to have the family group in costume, loosely suggesting modern times, or it might well be in strictly Biblical character.

We have emphasized this idea of the family group and function, in the little house balanced by the church in the border panels, and the man and woman at their work. These might also suggest the idea of Adam delving and Eve spinning. Then there are children playing, small animals, birds, flowers and stars.

Through the center are symbols of three of the Evangelists, Matthew, Mark and Luke, who record the incident of Christ Blessing Children; and the eagle symbol of the fourth Evangelist, Saint John, with a candle to suggest his text: "While ye have light, believe in the light, that ye may be the children of light." (12:36).

The main text: "Suffer little children to come unto Me," is designed at the base, with a possible space for a memorial inscription if one is required in the window.

The side panels are designed in alternate rose and lily patterns, symbolic of divine love and purity, with angels of praise and prayer.

Changes to be made in design: Eliminate the Biblical text in the lower part of the middle window, and substitute the memorial inscription given above. Also change costumes in the central medallion to represent Biblical times. The donors would like us to include some mauve glass in the border.
