Ruth, is the prototype of the Mother of Our Lord; with symbols of David and the Blessed Virgin, as well as of Christ. (Dean Eldridge had written, "Aside from the obvious "culms of barley," what should be the symbolism? How about a foreshadowing of the royal line of David - and Jesus?"

"Window devoted to Ruth.

The dominant figure is represented in garments of blue and white, traditional color symbols of heavenly contemplation and purity. She bears her "culms of barley", gleanings from the fields of Boaz.

The decorative growing vine around her, flowers in symbols of the Fruit of the Spirit as set forth by Saint Paul in his Epistle to the Galatians. These are, the Lily of Goodness, bells for Joy, the dove of Peace, the cross of Faith, the flaming rose of Love, and at her feet the violet and lamb of Meekness and Gentleness. She bears the pitcher of water for Temperance, also conveying a suggestion of the water of life, and above her head is the crown of Longsuffering.

In the field below are symbols of David, - the harp, the traditional monogram of the Blessed Virgin, and the crown and sceptre of Our Lord, thus suggesting the royal line of David."
