General Information To be devoted to two of Our LORD's Apostles, Saint Paul and Saint ~~Stephen~~ Timothy.

As planned, the accompanying design for the Stern Memorial is devoted to St. Paul and St. Timothy.

St. Paul holds the open book inscribed with the text from the first chapter of Corinthians, -- "Grace be unto you, and peace, from God..." (any other text you prefer may be used). He also bears the Sword of the Spirit, -- the symbol of his martyrdom. The accompanying medallion symbolizes the stirring incident on the way to Rome. In imminent danger of shipwreck, the reassuring angel appeared, -- "For there stood by me this night, the Angel of God, whose I am, and whom I serve, saying, fear not..."

Beside St. Paul stands St. Timothy robed as Bishop and bearing the closed book and staff. The accompanying medallion symbolizes his martyrdom, being slain with stones and clubs by the heathens while he was opposing their idolatrous ceremonies.

~~Saint Stephen holds his usual symbols, the bowl on which rests three stones, and the martyr's palm. The medallion represents his martyrdom.~~

IMPORTANT: They felt that Saint Stephen looks feminine in the sketch. Make him more masculine looking.

Note: We are to use Saint Timothy instead of Saint Stephen.
