General Information Mr. Davis of the Committee writes: "We...discussed  
the desirability of installing small sections of glass in each of the  
entrance doors so as to acquaint late-comers with what was going forward  
in the Chapel...Possibly clear leaded glass or at least a medallion  
in which some clear space would be incorporated would be satisfactory."

We suggested a simple leaded design, with sufficient clear glass to gain  
a view of the interior.

For addresses of those to be notified as window progresses, see other side.

We have also made a little suggestion for the doorlights. Their simple leaded pattern is made significant by the alpha and omega. The other pair could have similar symbols, such as the Chi Rho monogram, and the anchor cross.

Will you want to see through these panels? They can be made with clear glass or somewhat obscured with glasses of rough textures, as you wish.

Note: They want these doors slightly obscured; that is, so you cannot distinguish objects through, except in the two little pieces in the lower part, which should be clear.
