"Saint Peter and Saint Paul are represented in the lower portion, each with his traditional symbol below; crossed keys for Saint Peter, and the open book and sword of the spirit for Saint Paul.

Above is the ascending figure of Our Lord and at the top the Agnus Dei.

Rays of divine light descend through the decorative cloud forms, and the field is enriched with stars of divine steadfastness.

The color scheme is beautifully modulated to keep the lower portion deep and rich in order not to interfere with the altar, while the upper portions are somewhat lighter and more luminous, although in the actual glass all would be textured and patterned sufficiently to avoid too much glare in the face of the congregation."

In place of a memorial inscription at base, use "While He blessed them, He was parted from them, and carried up into heaven." (Saint Luke 24:51).
