General Information As this window will be given in memory of the donors' 4 year old boy, they wish to have some reference to children - using Luke 9:47-48 - done with a child and Our Lord instead of a group of children. Have a few of the apostles suggested in the background, to help the significance of the incident.

Window immediately to the east of the south vestibule entrance.

"...We have taken a chance that the new window you want may be in the alternating color scheme and have prepared the color sketch which we are sending you , herewith.

As planned, it symbolizes the passage from the ninth chapter of Saint Luke, verses forty-seven and forty-eight.

Our Lord and the young boy are the dominant figures, with a group of His apostles in the background , attentive to His lesson in purity and humility.

The ruby field of the medallion and the border are designed to alternate with the blue of the windows now in place, but blue is accented in other areas so that the overall balance is preserved.

The memorial inscription can be included near the base as in the other windows...."
