This window (panel), is to be devoted to the Boy Christ in the Temple, and is in memory of Jean Hedger Pittenger.

"...This design is devoted to the Boy Christ in the Temple. He stands in the midst of the Doctors, while the little figures of His parents are at the door, coming to find Him. Above, is the symbol of the Temple lamp, and below, the well-known I.H.C. monogram of Our Lord. The kneeling angel holds the open book of learning. Through the border are the flames of religious zeal, balancing the fleur-de-lis, in the companion windows. The design will harmonize beautifully with the earlier windows, and carrying on the theme of the Life of Christ. "
