General Information Gethsemane, similar to the window in Smithfield, Virginia, but without so many olive branches and flowers. They would rather have a simpler theme surrounding the central figure of Christ.

To be a gem of color and light.

Mr. Allison writes: "There is a driveway to the south of the Church; but the north side opens into a patio which will be attractively planted and which, in turn, is flanked by the existing one-story Fellowship Hall structure, which is parallel to the Church. The summer sunlight in Riverside tends to be very strong, and the temperatures are high. This, of course, should be borne in mind in the design of any windows on the south exposure. Conditions in Riverside, which is not far from the Imperial Valley desert climate, are considerably different from those even in Los Angeles, which is near the ocean, and I should think the use of rather deep colors in south windows should be indicated."

The rose is devoted to a direct presentation of the Gethsemane theme, based on the one you liked, but without the involved patterning surrounding the central motif.
