General Information See color photographs of present windows and diagram of 1 subjects sent by Dr. Case. Also print of first church of the Methodists d. Waltham.

When Dr. Case saw the rough sketch - he suggested reducing the figures somewhat, making more of the globes at the bases of the side windows - right hand to be the Globe - left hand to have the tower or the entire church in the circle - with the idea that Christ has jurisdiction over Church and State.

We have now completed our study of the design for your upper side window and are enclosing the rough color sketch herewith. It is intended to suggest color and light in action and all the exquisite detail of line and form is left for development in the full size drawings and the actual glass.

At the center is the ascending figure of Christ, clothed in garments of radiant white. Below are the kneeling figures of two of His Apostles, and the text, - " All power is given unto Me in Heaven and in earth ", from Saint Matthew's, twenty-eighth chapter, eighteenth verse. In the decorative foliated border are the Keys of the Kingdom of Heaven; and the descending Dove with the Olive Branch.

Above are symbols of the ~~First Methodist Church in the state at Lynn, founded in 1791 with eight members; and the first Church of the Methodists of Waltham,~~ (at the left); and Wesley's Chapel in London (City Road Chapel), (at the right.)

At the top is the CHI RHO monogram of Our Lord.

The panels at either side are enriched with attendant angels, with symbols below; at the left, the globe surmounted by the cross suggesting Christ's domination over the world, - " I will build my church ", and at the right, the globe of the world, suggesting the scope of the missionary spirit, - " Teach all nations."

The ruby border is accented with stars of heavenly steadfastness.

As this window goes over the windows now in place, we will have to keep in mind a blending - more greens and oranges, rather than blues, etc.. We told Dr. Case that we would remove one of the sections of the lower windows and fill it with some sort of material to keep out the weather, so that we would have it here for comparison.
