This window is devoted to Our Lord who is represented with arms outstretched in an attitude of welcome, suggesting the text "Come unto Me." His pure white and ruby garments are the colors of Purity and Divine Love, in mediæval symbolism, and the gold implies treasures in heaven.

He is surrounded by a decorative growing pattern of grape and wheat that suggests the Sacramental theme. The grape also symbolizes the unity and fruitfulness of the Church through His significant words, "I am the vine, ye are the branches."

At the base is the inscription "The Ladies' Aid 1903-1957".
