Inscription...differentiate in handling.)

There will be inscriptions, but not prominently placed. In the Baptistry, we could lower the inscription from the field to the border, and make the medallion larger. Text to be the same in both windows: "In Memory of Mrs. Maria Jerabeck." (See letter of October 14, 1954, for verification).

General Information...One window to be devoted to the Baptism of Our Lord. (South). This to be like the one in St. Andrew's Church, Akron.

The other window is to be devoted to the "Fall of Man." "The Expulsion". (West).

Father Glavin wants to see these two windows before he enters into the contract for the rest of them.

Important: "The Architect writes: "...I would like to suggest that there be a generous absence of green in any of these windows."

As suggested, the baptistry windows are devoted to the Baptism of Our Lord by Saint John the Baptist, and the Resurrection.

These windows are, again, kept luminous, but with a feeling of rich, full color.
