General Information This design presents four figures distinctively related to the divine mission of Our Lord; on the left, the Blessed Virgin Mary and S. Joseph; on the right S. Simeon and S. John the Baptist. Above are figures of Angels of Prayer and Praise, with censer and trumpet.

Dr. Bennett wrote: "The last window you put in is the gem of them all. I like the rich blending of color in the window."

When making the window, cut tracery sections apart, so that they can set them easily. Keep tracery joints very simple. Provide thru-leads running across and only lightly solder the joints.

East aisle window - This window presents figures distinctly related to the divine mission of Our Lord. On the left, the Blessed Virgin Mary and Saint Joseph, with his traditional flowering staff; on the right, Simeon and Saint John the Baptist, with his rustic crossed staff and shell of Baptism. In the heads of the lancets are Angels of Prayer and Praise with censer and trumpet, and in the principal tracery shape, another member of the angelic choir in an attitude of worship.
