General Information Perhaps this choir window could be a little simpler than
the chancel window, making it \$1000 instead of \$1200. 2/28/56.

This window can be considerably lighter and warmer, with more ruby and
gold; but should be in general harmony with the chancel window.
To have the central symbol of the Lamp of Wisdom.

It is planned to harmonize with the chancel window, but in a considerably warmer and lighter key. Rubies and golds are more in evidence.

The design is not quite so elaborate as the one for the chancel window, as we have in mind a cost of one thousand dollars for it, while the chancel window is to cost twelve hundred dollars.

As planned, the dominant symbol is the Lamp of Wisdom; and the secondary symbols are the flames of divine zeal and the stars of heavenly steadfastness. The positions of these are reversed from the chancel window, where the stars were through the blue fields, and the flames in the borders.

We feel that each window will beautifully complement the other, and each will take its place to excellent purpose.

Note: In actual drawings and glass, perhaps center medallion between bars - to come down to bar.
