General Information Miracle, "Healing the Nobleman's Son (of Fever). (John 4:46).
The Works of Mercy - "To Comfort the Sorrowful; and To bear
wrongs patiently.
Beatitude, "Blessed are they that Mourn" (2nd Beatitude)

The windows on the north side - ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ third and
fourth from the chancel are about 6 feet from the ground. 1/2" rebate set
in putty from outside.

Floor plan on sheet 3382.

This window is devoted to the second Beatitude: "Blessed are they that Mourn, for they shall be comforted", inscribed on the open book in the lower part of the central panel.

The dominant medallion above represents Our Lord's Miracle of Healing the Nobleman's Son of Fever (John 4:46).

As in the other windows, the angels at either side bear symbols of two of the Works of Mercy, - in this case, at the left, to Comfort the Sorrowful - the Inverted Torch, traditional symbol that is also indicative of those that Mourn; and, at the right, the Passion Flower, traditional symbol of Longsuffering and "to Bear Wrongs Patiently."

Across the base is the memorial inscription: "To the Glory of God and in Loving Memory of John R. Macomber 1875-1955."
