This window to be devoted to The Great Commission. Portray with a symbol of Christ issuing the command to "Go into all the world". Symbols of the Apostles and others who obeyed this great command could be inwrought.

(This would probably be the same color scheme as the Baptism design)

your window, symbolizing the Great Commission, and are sending you the color sketch herewith.

Our Lord stands before His apostles as He tells them to go and teach all nations. In one hand, He holds the book inscribed with the Cross to symbolize their teaching, and in the other, the globe surmounted by the Cross, suggesting the power and triumph of that teaching over all the world,—"all power is given unto us in heaven and in earth".

Through the foliated border, are symbols of the eleven. The basket and tau Cross of Philip, the cup and serpent of St. John the Evangelist, the keys of Saint Peter, the carpenter's square and spear for Saint Thomas, the saw for Saint James Minor, the pilgrim's hat and staff of Saint James Major, the staff of Saint Jude, and the flying knives for Saint Bartholomew. The cross of Saint Andrew is indicated in the lower center; while in the lower corners of the light field, are the purse of Saint Matthew, and the box and fish for Saint Simon.

At the top of the window, is the flame of Divine seal and sacrifice of the disciples.
