Later suggestions for reduced size: Mr. Whitehouse wrote: "...I enclose one
of the early Epiphany sketches and wondered if we could get anywhere near
this design..." We replied "...we can now include subject medallions for
the \$1200 allowance. We have prepared a rough color sketch to show you how
nicely this will work out. The medallions might well be devoted to
significant incidents from the Life of Christ; or His Parables and Miracles;
or any of the many other significant themes."

*O.E.S. writes: "The axial windows get clear light. Some pines near middle of
sides, but not too close."

We are sending you our rough study for the nave windows of your Manito Presbyterian Church.

While the design is based on simple rectangles, the suggestions of foliated pattern will relieve its simplicity, and will result in an interesting and decorative patterning.

We have suggested Saint Peter's symbol, with the thought that ten of the Apostles could be represented.

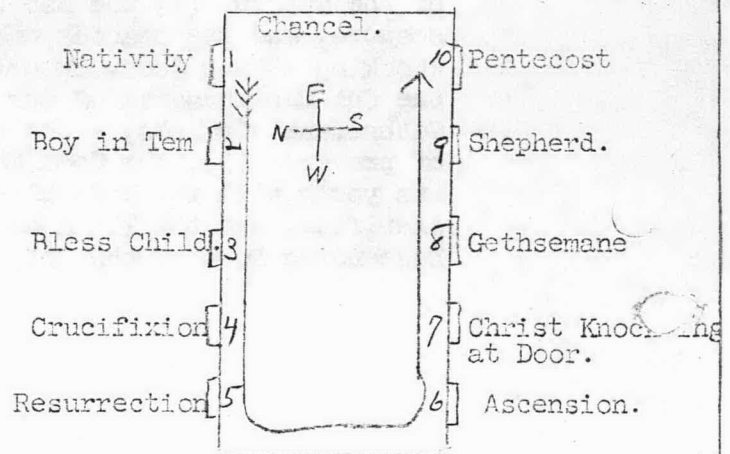
However, there are, of course, a great many other ideas, including simple Christian symbols, such as the Anchor Cross, the Descending Dove, the Rose of Divine Love, the Lily of Purity, and many more.

I think we can undertake these at twelve hundred dollars each if at least five of them can be made at the same time; otherwise, I think we should have to omit the four colorful rectangular units through the field, - three below and one above the dominant symbol.

Later sketch sent Dec. 21, 1955: "We have your reduced window size for the Manito Presbyterian Church. We did not find that you had included the early Epiphany sketch, so we do not know which of the two suggestions you had in mind, but I think we can now include subject-medallions for the twelve hundred dollar allowance. We have prepared a rough color sketch to show you how nicely this will work out. The medallions might well be devoted to significant incidents from the Life of Christ; or His Parables and Miracles; or any of the many other significant themes."

The ten nave subjects are to be as follows:

- The Nativity
- The Boy Christ Disputing with the Doctors in the Temple.
- Jesus Blessing Little Children.
- The Crucifixion
- The Resurrection
- The Ascension
- Christ Knocks at the Door
- Prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane
- The Shepherd Scene
- Pentecost - Acts 1.8.

Color sketches for the nave windows -
Spokane, Washington,
Manito Presbyterian Church.

The design for the first, the Nativity already submitted.
The design for the second, devoted to the Boy Christ disputing
with the Doctors in the Temple, represents the alternate color
arrangement with the blue and the ruby transposed. Symbols, - the
seven-branched candlestick of the Temple and the six-pointed star
of the Old Dispensation.

The rest are not carried beyond the principal medallion and
symbols, but ... will be in harmony with the two first.

As planned, these develop the life of Our Lord with (3) Jesus
Blessing Little Children. Symbols, - the unicorn of purity and
the Alpha and Omega; (4) the Crucifixion with John and Mary beside
the cross. Symbols, - Saint Peter's crowing cock and the pillar and
scourges. (5) The Resurrection, - Our Lord coming forth from the dark
tomb bearing the banner of victory and the sleeping soldiers below.
Symbols, - the phoenix arising anew from its flaming nest, - the symbol
of the Resurrection, and the pomegranate, emblem of the fruitfulness
of the Church. (6) the Ascension. Symbols, - the Heavenly crown and
sceptre, and the peacock, emblem of immortality. (7), Christ
knocking at the door. Symbols, the fountain of living waters and
the Chi Rho monogram of Our Lord. (8) Prayer in the Garden of
Gethsemane. Symbols, - the chalice and cross, and the censer, emblem
of prayer. (9), the Good Shepherd. Symbols, - the pelican feeding
its young with its life blood, - symbol of Our Lord's love and
sacrifice, and the IHC monogram. (10) Pentecost. Symbols, the
Descending Dove of the Holy Spirit and the sevenfold flame.
