General Information **The Evangelist, Saint John. This goes next to the St. Luke window already made, and should be the opposite color scheme. The Mark design is also made.**

The other window for the south side is devoted to Saint John who holds his traditional symbol the chalice, from which issues a serpent or dragon, recalling the legend of the poisoned cup from which he drank without harm. He is robed in garments of ruby and white, ancient color symbols of divine Love and Purity. Below, the pen and open book of his writings with the closing words of Revelations, - "The Grace of Our Lord...be with you". In the lancet head is his Evangelical symbol, the winged Eagle.

The field is again enriched with growing vine forms outlining the medallions and flowering in the white fleur-de-lis of Purity.

The inscription reads, - "In Loving Memory of James T. Abbott, ^{by}

his family and friends"
