General Information The Pastor's idea is for a central dominant figure group in this chancel window, representing Our Lord welcoming and counselling two young people, - a young man and a girl in modern costume. He has a colored picture of a painting by Lee. The original he thinks is somewhere in Philadelphia that shows a front view of Christ beckoning the children and pointing back toward a city in the horizon. The Pastor thinks he can get a copy for us. The young people at either side face toward Him - the girl in short skirt, and the boy in a dark suit. He, evidently, is telling them to fix up the world.

In the central tracery above, he wants a symbol of the World Council of Churches (with the ship and initials).

The two side panels they would like just in decorative pattern - representing Noah's Ark and the Barque of Peter. They want the whole thing to be very colorful and very elaborate - jewelled windows.
