See photograph of first window installed, and for sketches of others
being made. These 8 windows furnish practically all the interior
lighting for the nave. No windows in the chancel. There is only about
7 feet between the pairs.

The subject of this window is Elisha, in left panel; and Healing the
Widow's Son in the left panel. RED medallion backgrounds.

II Kings 4:32-37.

Luke 7:11

The left panel of the fourth window from the chancel on the south side is devoted to Elisha and the Raising of the Shunammite's Son. The mother kneels before Elisha while the son, in bed, has revived, as recorded in II Kings 4:32-37. Below is the brazen serpent raised in the wilderness, and at the bottom is the text, - "He...prayed unto the Lord."

In the right panel is represented the Healing of the Widow's Son at Nain. Our Lord stands beside the bier as the son revives. Below is the symbol of the healing oil stock, and the text, - "Young man, arise."

Important change: In cartoons - The Rector writes: "I see that you have made more of a pyx than what I had in mind for oil stock and...I had in mind a small round brass container with a screw top in which was placed the cotton and the blessed oil. A ring is formed from the bottom of the oil stock so that it may be placed on one of the fingers on the left hand and used as the hands are placed on the persons head. DO THIS VERY CAREFULLY IN THE FULL SIZE DRAWING."
