These two windows to be devoted to the Sacraments of Baptism and the Blessed Sacrament. Simple treatment, with symbols of the Shell of Baptism, and of the Chalice.

These windows to be kept light so they will not materially reduce the luminosity at the altar.

Note: vents and bars in place.

Note: This is the job that the setter, Marlowe, requested us to tack the cusps lightly for easy setting.

They are devoted to Baptism and the Blessed Sacrament.

In the north window the shell of Baptism is represented on a field symbolizing water. At the base, an open book is inscribed with the significant text, - "Be born anew of water and the Holy Ghost".

The Fleur-de-lis of purity and the rose of divine love accent the silvery field, and the flame of divine zeal occurs above the book.

Again, the shell and fleur-de-lis enrich the wide border, and at the top is the Dove of the Holy Spirit.

The warmer colors are accented in the north window, while cooler colors predominate in the south window.

The Chalice holds the dominant position in the latter with the open book inscribed with the text, - "Take this Holy Sacrament to your comfort".

The grapevine is symbolized in the border, while again the flame, fleur-de-lis and the Descending Dove are represented.
