General Information This window is to include the figures of Simon, Thomas and Matthew (from left to right), with the text "The strife is o'er".

This window will complete the group of four. See photographs of windows in place and design for the third window.

Floor plan on Card.

As planned, this window is devoted to the Apostles, Simon, Thomas and Matthew. They each hold their traditional symbols: Saint Simon, the saw, traditionally known as the instrument of his martyrdom; Saint Thomas, the spear and book inscribed with the cross; and Saint Matthew, the purse, as collector of customs.

The kneeling members of the angelic choir in the quatrefoils hold symbols of the Archangels, Raphael and Uriel, - the pilgrim's staff and gourd, and the flaming sun.

At the base of the central panel is the lettering: "The strife is o'er", - the first verse from the Easter Hymn that continues through the four windows.
