General Information We can put in 3 divisions wide, if we wish, and possibly a color line border, and devoted the whole theme to nature subjects, possibly conventionalized floral patterns in the nature of the roses in the Couch Memorial, North Adams, flowers and birds and animals, as in that same window, and the Saint Francis window in the Children's Hospital, Cincinnati. Light Cathedral backgrounds - probably slightly on the warm side, accented with fine notes of ruby and blue, and other colors - touches of green and gold, etc.

This design is planned to take advantage of all the available illumination, with rough textured glasses to catch and reflect side lights, accented with pure brilliant color.

It celebrates elements of joy and growth in all nature, with the central symbol of the Fountain of Life.

Over this is the rainbow, and at either side are growing flowering trees, and singing birds.

In the panels at left and right are the sun and moon, with more nature symbols.
