General Information "...the general plan of the windows in S. Paul's Church, Walla Walla..."

These panels are separated by a stone mullion 4" wide. These windows are at the back, up over the doorway, and can hardly be seen because of the wooden screen which is about four feet from the doorway and which hides the windows so that they cannot be seen except from the aisle as you come almost to the wooden screen. I would feel that these 4 windows would surely not be treated with the deference which should be given to the other two.

These to be designed in simple leaded patterns, accented with Christian symbolism, - The Trinity, Everlasting Life, Saints, etc - to be purely decorative. The Hand of God, The Dove, The Lamb, and Globe surmounted by the Cross.

BE SURE TO USE BLACK PUTTY. OUTSIDE. There are quarter-inch tee bars in place that we think might remain.

These windows are designed in rich color relieved with passages of silvery tones to admit illumination. These lighter tints are enriched with foliated pattern supporting full color medallions devoted to significant Christian symbols. They include The Trinity with the Hand of God from the clouds in the cruciform halo, the descending Dove of the Holy Spirit, and the Lamb bearing the cruciform banner of victory. The fourth is the Globe surmounted by the Cross symbolizing Our Lord's triumph over the world.
