Vents Yes. Plan on smaller vents. (At present there is one vent in each pair. We are to replace these with smaller drop-in vents about 7" high, ea panel.

Height from floor 4 feet. Protection Glass. Groove Rabbit. Metal Stone. Wood Wood.

Ralph W. McGinnis - 1886-1942."

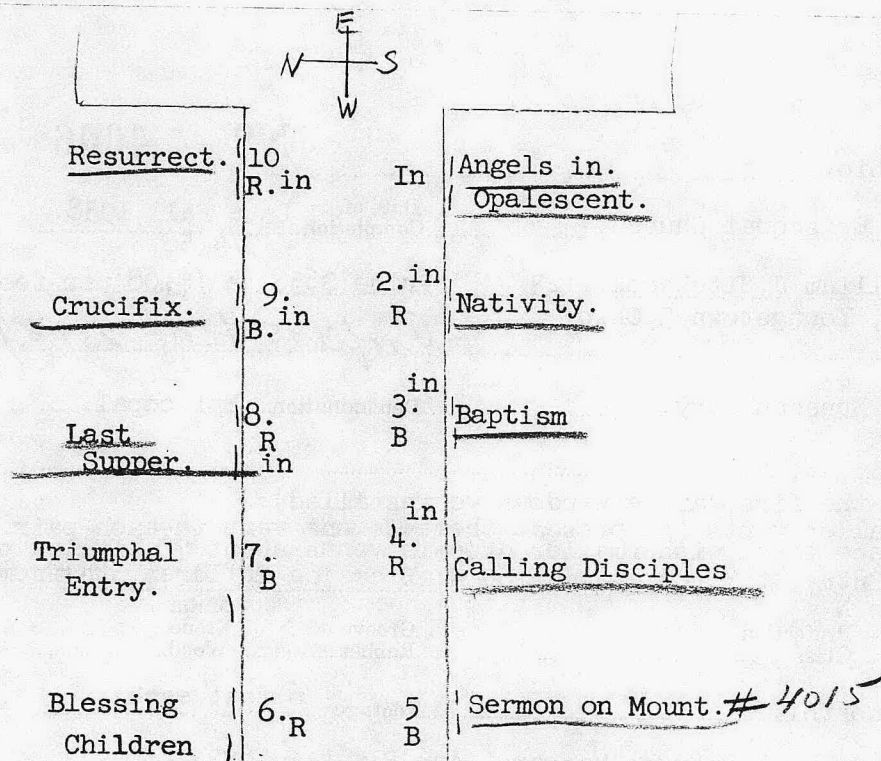

General Information The first window is devoted to two angelic figures. This may eventually be moved to some other place. This is opalescent glass.. See floor plan other side, and photographs of windows in place.

NOTE: The window devoted to the Sermon on the Mount, together with the repair pieces were shipped in February, 1958; but are being held for installation until these are completed.



The last on the south side is devoted to the Sermon on the Mount. Again, Our Lord stands in one panel addressing the multitude opposite. The text indicated is, - "Ye are the light of the world... let your light shine before men (Matthew 14:16). Other texts might be more appropriate, - for instance, - "He went up into a mountain and taught them", - or one of the Beatitudes, - "Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." *4015*

The first from the entrance on the north presents Christ blessing little children. He holds one small child in His arms, while a mother with an infant and two larger children are composed in the companion panel. The text is, - "He took them up in His arms and blessed them." (Mark 10:16). ~~Other texts would be equally appropriate, such as the usual one, - "Suffer little children to come unto Me and forbid them not."~~

Next is the Triumphal entry into Jerusalem, - with Our Lord riding upon the donkey and the welcoming group with palms. The text is, - "Blessed be the King that cometh in the name of the Lord." (Luke 19:38).
