General Information Note: This window to be carried out in the same plan as the design for the Incarnation window.

LENT: - Penance - Scourge in tracery.
Right panel: Paul baptizing Lydia (Acts 16:14).
Left panel: Christ being baptized.
Small: Prayer at the Temptation.
Red scheme.

See photographs and designs for windows being made. Mr. Willis says these ought to be kept small in scale to go with the first one, although he agreed that we could simplify the borders (see slide of the first window by Lamb). Our windows to be kept light and sparkling to let in more light.

Lent is the general theme of the one in the predominantly warm palette,- the first from the entrance on the Gospel side. The scourges are the symbol of Penance in the tracery member.

At the right, Saint Paul baptizes Lydia, and opposite, Christ is baptized by Saint John the Baptist. In the medallion below, Our Lord is represented in prayer at His Temptation. Satan offers Him the glory of the kingdoms of the world, while angels minister unto Him. Through the ruby borders are shells of Baptism.
