This window goes between the Garry and the Protestant Missionary window. Note that the type of window they like best there is the Pentecost window. Our records show that this Catholic window is to be the Blue scheme.

We have completed our study of the design for the Catholic Missionaries window and are sending you the rough color sketch, herewith. It follows the general plan of the Whitsunday window which you like.

Reading upward, the lower medallion represents Father De Smet acting as peacemaker in the difficult negotiations with the hostile Indians; - a service he rendered to the Government on several occasions from 1851 to 1858.

At the center he presents the Douay Bible to his friend, Marcus Whitman; and above, he gives his banner to the Indians after persuading Sitting Bull to meet the Commissioners and make peace. The banner bore "the holy name of Jesus on one side and on the other the image of the Virgin Mary, surrounded with gilt stars."

Mr. Whitehouse writes that they want ruby instead of the orange-reds suggested in the design.
