General Information This is to be the Paul MacGahan Memorial Window. See picture of the reredos which Dr. Burnham sent.

Donor likes "very small panes, red, blue and purples, and several figures in each, nothing modern would look well there..."

Paul MacGahan (Miss MacGahan father), was an electrical engineer and held some fifty different patents with Westinghouse Electric Company. She hopes to have a design which will be appropriate with his character and work.

The window openings are set deeply into the stone facade.

Subjects to be Saint Cecilia and Saint Paul "maybe some angels as in the color plate of (Waban,) with big wings." Donor likes the colorful wings.

The windows in place in the chancel are three Archangels, with vivid reds and blues mostly.

Donor doesn't like single figures.

This window is directly above the choir stalls, in the most conspicuous spot.

As suggested, it is devoted to Saint Cecilia and Saint Paul with attendant Angels. Saint Cecilia holds her traditional symbol of the organ, and Saint Paul has the book and the sword of the spirit.

Members of the Angelic choir bear the trumpet of praise and the censer of prayer, while others are represented in the attitude of prayer. Their ruby wings form interesting patterns through the pure blue fields.
