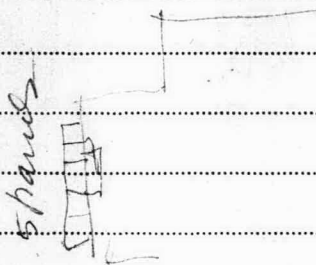
General Information. Our Lord Blessing Little Children.

(They like especially the window we made for Nantucket, with this theme.)

They think Mrs. Johnson's window in place is too bright and does not blend with the other windows.

They would like to come to see the work in process:



As planned, it is devoted to Our Lord Blessing Little Children. He holds a small child in His arms, while another stands before Him, and another brings a younger one. Others play at His feet.

Members of the Angelic Choir kneel in prayer above.

In the earlier window a central vertical mullion had to be removed to make one opening of the window. This was done by a Mr. Harry Brown who was then treasurer of the Church, but we understand he is no longer there.

We are not sure whether this must be done in this case, but it is not a difficult matter for any carpenter, and no doubt there is a member of your Church who can do this to best advantage. A carpenter would also be necessary in changing the position of windows.

It is somewhat doubtful if some of the older windows would stand removal from the sash and replacement in another opening. It would be best not to disturb their setting.

Note: Some of the people feel that the Johnson window is too strong on the blues. They wish we could subdue the blues in the new window. But as the two windows will go side by side, this will have to be carefully studied.

They will plan to move the angel in the center panel to the extreme left panel, and make the changes in the frame when the new window is complete. Alterations in frame and moving of the old window to be taken care of by the Church.
