Vents Position in Church Two outer panels and tracery above each, of the south aisle window nearest the entrance (Epistle side). Height from floor 6 feet. Protection Glass Groove Rabbet Metal Stone Wood 22' in the 2 side panels & 37' in the entire window. Footage Entire window, 37'. Remaining tracery.

Inscription Not yet received. (See lettering in center panel in place). Inscription for left panel to come at a later time - provide space for it. Inscription for right panel: "In memory of Jeanne Lawrence Stevens, 1921-1925." See contract.

General Information *Price: Cost to be \$900 for each panel, or if the two outside panels are installed at one time, \$1700 for the pair.

(Center panel devoted to Entry into Jerusalem is in place).

The Rector writes "This window as a whole should be designed in a style very similar to the one you have just completed which blends harmoniously with the other windows in the nave" (See photograph of our first window and slides of other windows in the Church. This window goes opposite our earlier window.

This window is devoted to the Cleansing of the Temple, the Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem (in place), and Jesus and His enemies, - the Scribes and Pharisees. The left panel, Our Lord casts out those who bought and sold in the Temple. Above is a symbol of the cleansed Temple enclosing the cross of salvation. At the right, Our Lord opposed by His enemies is symbolized by the healing of the man with the withered hand on the Sabbath. Above are the Scribes and Pharisees taking counsel against Him. The symbol of the Scales, encircled by the net, recalls Our Lord's accusation of the Scribes and Pharisees, - "Ye have omitted the weightier matters of the Law, - Justice, Mercy, and Faith (Matthew 23:23). The fields and borders are designed to harmonize with the neighboring windows.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Be sure to make the figure compositions in the side panels smaller to harmonize with the first three-panel window now in place. put this note on the design in red pencil.
