General Information This panel to be devoted to Saint Paul. Include background incident, as in St. Philip window, - the Conversion of Paul.

Use the blue background.

This will complete the block of four panels - and will come next to St. Stephen.

See photographs of earlier windows.

As planned, it is devoted to Saint Paul. He is represented with the open book of his Epistles and the sword of his martyrdom which can also be interpreted as the sword of the spirit.

In the field is a symbol of his conversion on the Damascus Road. He kneels before the vision of Our Lord while his horse rears in terror. The letter is not very clear at this small scale, but you can be sure all the details of line and form will be beautifully developed as you see it in the earlier windows.

The surrounding decorative architectural "canopy" is designed to harmonize with that in the other windows so that all may serve as a well related group.
