General Information This is to be the blue window; that is, the one with the quatrefoil at the top, with flaming torch at top - the basket of bread and roses as the principal medallion in the second position; the scroll in the third position, arranged horizontally like sketch; and the open book at the bottom.

The basket is the dominant symbol, and the three others are secondary. It was voted to just indicate lettering on the book and the scroll with nothing definite; but later the Catholic Chaplain said his idea was to have the Alpha and Omega on the book, and the Hebrew characters for God on the scroll. We could suggest it, and when some of their committee come in, it could be decided.

Be sure to have committee in to see the work in process.
