General Information This is to be another American Legion Window.... symbols of the Three Chaplaincies, - Star of David, Crucifix and Cross with symbols of Four Evangelists. Then a unifying symbol of the ~~Four~~ Chaplains represented at Boston University. Arrangement so none of three has greater importance by the open book from which a ribbon runs through the background with ~~through the background~~, have a text of 15 or 20 words to express the unity of the Chaplaincy.*

This will probably be the more expensive type.

This window to be the alternate scheme to the V.F.W. Window. Background pattern more like the American Legion Window, and not like the V.F.W. as these windows come side by side.

*Chaplain Olsen suggests the following text: "Dedicated to the Chaplains for their faithful ministry, ~~to the patients~~ ~~and~~ their exemplary spirit of true brotherhood and interfaith cooperation." (For the background text).

This window is designed to honor the Hospital Chaplains.

The dominant central symbol is the Open Book, the universal Word of God, from which flows a ribbon uniting symbols of the Star of David, the Crucifix, and the Cross with symbols of the four Evangelists.

The ribbon bears the text: "Dedicated to the Chaplains for their faithful ministry, exemplary spirit of true brotherhood and interfaith cooperation".

Again, stars of steadfast faith occur through the field, and flames of divine seal enrich the foliated borders.

At the base is the inscription, "The Gift of George A. Campbell Post 101 American Legion."
