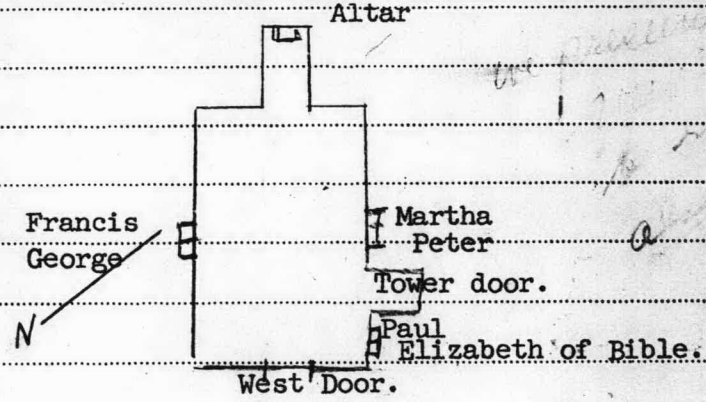

As planned, it is devoted to Saint Paul and Saint Elizabeth. Saint Paul holds the book of his writings inscribed with the traditional symbol of the three fountains, and the sword of the spirit, which is also the sword of his martyrdom.

The inscription reads, - "In Memory of Robert and Elizabeth Burke."

While this is a very rough design the actual window will, of course, be carried out in full detail similar to our windows now in place.

We have kept in mind the cost of one thousand, two hundred fifty dollars for the window. We presume new frames will be required as in the other windows. We can supply these at an additional cost of twenty-five dollars, making a total of thirteen hundred dollars.
