General Information Two groups of three panels each on one side receiving daylight; and two groups on the other side, one of three and one of two panels receiving only artificial light from a corridor. Each panel 17 5/8" wide by 47 5/8" high, sight. Ventilators 17 5/8" high, with a division bar 1 3/4" wide, now leaded in light amber 3/8" lead. Each panel 4 1/2" wide by 5 5/8" high, sight.

The vents are at the top on the artificially lighted side, and at the bottom at the daylight side.

They would like to have a plan for inserting Christian symbols, some only in painted line, perhaps some in color.

They now have a donor who wishes to contribute \$150 toward the inserts in these chapel windows. Earlier we had given prices of \$10 for very simple ones, \$25 for the more elaborate, and \$50 for leaded and colored ones, and that the installation might be by local craftsman. Dr. Ziegler would like "some concrete suggestions concerning what could be done with Christian symbols or historic forms of the cross for \$25 each. Perhaps place at same time as the Choir Room windows?" Feb. 19, 1960 - Dr. Ziegler writes that they are receptive to the idea of some costing more - \$35-\$50. (See other side also)

The other group has the Chi Rho monogram of Our Lord at the center, with historic forms of the cross at either side, -the diagonal Saltire cross or cross of Saint Andrew, the Latin cross, and two variations of the ancient Anchor cross, symbolizing both Hope and Faith.
