Architect writes: This might consist of one figure in the central lancet with decorative and symbolic designs in the side lancets. Could you sketch this up sometime, with decreased size and increased simplicity, to get it within the amount noted: "

Architect has written: "In order not to cut off light too completely from the choir, I think that this particular window should have at least 50% grisaille glass with colored border, and possibly colored figures and symbols."

Other windows in the series are 28 inches longer (vent in center panel is about 18 inches high.

*Willis Writes: "Your new glass is to be installed in an existing opening which we are having to shorten somewhat in order to put a door through underneath. At

present this opening is filled with a memorial window by Arthur Dalling. This memorial window will have to be relocated in a similar opening further down the nave, now filled with plain glass. Your contract with the church should cover moving the present memorial window and setting it in the other opening where it

This window near the pulpit is devoted to Christ the Preacher and Teacher. He stands at the center with the book inscribed with the cross.

In the left panel is the sacred monogram I.H.C., and at the right, the Alpha and Omega.

In the tracery above are Angels of Praise and Prayer with trumpet and censor.

Stars of heavenly steadfastness further enrich the fields designed in foliated pattern.

Gave price of \$530 for removing and reinstalling Dallin window, giving church benefit of any saving.

The Dallin figure window which will be next to this one is hard to know just what the subjects are - perhaps Paul at Athens in one panel, and perhaps Peter and John in some incidents in the other two. The window in the chancel is very blue with geometric ornamental background, with symbols, the Hand of God, the Lamb and the Four Evangelists; the opposite front window is in light grisaille - sort of a Canterbury type, with the Good Shepherd at the center and an angel on either side; the three Chapel windows are very blue, devoted to the Nine Fruit, and are by Lamb; the middle aisle window opposite is an old and dark window devoted to the Resurrection. There is a narrow fillet line around both lancets and tracery in the Dallin window. O.E.S. took slid of windows.
