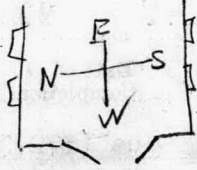
General Information They want light and brilliant, but colorful windows for the four entrance vestibule windows.. 12 inches between lancets.

Vestibule is light colored stone

To represent the four Evangelists; something in the manner of the side chancel windows in S. Paul's Church, Rochester, but with smaller figures, as in the corridor windows at Northminster, with the evangelistic symbols. Scale the figures something like the south sanctuary window in Saint Peter's Pro-Cathedral, Helena.
Include space for brief memorial inscriptions.

We have represented the windows at one side of the entrance vestibule with the figures of Saints Matthew and Mark. Each holds his evangelistic pen and book, and below are their traditional symbols, - the winged man for Saint Matthew and the winged lion of Saint Mark.

The fields are kept light and silvery to admit an abundance of illumination.

With your approval of this general plan we shall prepare the designs for the remaining two evangelists, - Saint Luke and Saint John, to complete the group.
