General Information This window will be a foliated pattern (It comes between two windows in the geometric pattern).

Refer to photographs and Kodachromes of windows in place.

November 29, 1960 - "We have prepared two more designs either one of which would be very appropriate for the side entrance vestibule window. I prefer the lighter one marked A for this position to take advantage of the limited light. The other could be kept available for the opposite window on the south side which could very well be illuminated by artificial light, as I outlined some time ago..."

WE ARE TO KEEP THIS WINDOW VERY LIGHT AND SPARKLING TO TAKE EVERY ADVANTAGE OF THE AVAILABLE LIGHT.

The following note was attached to the sketch when it was returned to us:
"Larry, we have selected the original design by Connick, but be sure to tell them that the tint should be much lighter because the outside is in the vestibule and not exposed to the usual light and sunshine. I am sure they will compensate for this if they are reminded of this fact. Charlie."
