General Information Theme: Christ setting a child down among His disciples, as set forth in Matthew, Chapter 18. (Christ and the child, and one of two disciples in one panel, and the rest of the disciples in the other.) See color plates of the two-panel group in same elevation - next to the one now in place, also single panel

These windows will go opposite the earlier windows we placed there, but are at a higher elevation, as they are up high enough to be over a covered archway that goes on the side of the chapel.

As planned, it is devoted to Our Lord teaching Christian Humility and Charity as recorded in the eighteenth Chapter of Saint Matthew's Gospel.

In the first panel, Christ stands with the child before Him teaching the way of true Christian life. Some of the Apostles are grouped around Him, while the others are represented in the companion panel. Above them is the symbol of the Kingdom of Heaven with Christ enthroned, attended by Angels.

Lambs near the spaces provided for the memorial inscriptions suggest the concern of the Shepherd for those of His great flock that have gone astray, and His rejoicing in their safe return, as recorded later in the same Chapter.
